XIII LAW3M - Guidelines for Abstract Submission and Presentations

This document provides the main information on abstract submission and presentations for the XIII Latin American Workshop on Magnetism, Magnetic Materials, and their Applications (XIII LAW3M). Abstract Submission

1. Authors must complete their registration in the Conference System before submitting an abstract to the XIII LAW3M. At least one author must be registered and present at the Workshop to present the accepted contribution. Each registration allows the submission of up to two abstracts;
2. During the abstract submission process, authors must select one technical category that best describes their contribution;
3. Abstract template must be downloaded from www.law3m2026.org. The MS Word file provided is the official template for abstracts (invited presentations, oral talks, and posters) to be submitted to the XIII LAW3M;
4. Since the abstracts will be directly reproduced in the conference proceedings distributed to the attendees, authors are kindly requested to strictly follow the template and the formatting instructions described below;
5. To prepare your abstract, replace the title, author names (the presenting author must be underlined), affiliations, and the abstract body text, keeping the original font type, size, and style of the template;
6. The abstract body and references must be single-spaced, fully justified, and typed in Times New Roman, 12 pt, normal style. Neither indentations nor blank lines should appear between paragraphs in the abstract body;

7. MS Word symbols and equations are allowed;
8. One figure or one table may be directly inserted into the abstract file (see Figure 1). Figures (images or graphs in JPG or PNG format) must have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi. A caption must be placed below the figure or table;
9. Up to three references are allowed per abstract;
10. The abstract must be limited to one page, including title, authors, affiliations, figures, tables, and references;
11. Abstracts must be submitted electronically in PDF format via the Conference System. No other file formats will be accepted;
12. Abstract submission will be acknowledged automatically by the system. Updates to submitted abstracts are allowed;
13. Corresponding authors will be notified of acceptance or rejection of their abstract by e-mail;
14. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to assign the presentation format (plenary, oral, or poster) based on the scientific program;
15. Thank you for contributing to the XIII LAW3M, and we look forward to seeing you in Natal, October 19-23, 2026.

Presentations

1. The official language of the Workshop is English. No simultaneous translation service will be provided;
2. The Workshop program will consist of plenary lectures, invited talks, oral contributions, and poster sessions, as selected by the Organizing Committee;
3. The Workshop program will comprise one plenary session, as well as one or two additional parallel rooms for oral presentations. The scientific program is expected to include:
 - 5 plenary lectures (50 minutes plus 10 minutes for questions);
 - 4 invited long talks (30 minutes plus 6 minutes for questions);
 - Short oral contributions (10 minutes plus 2 minutes for questions), selected from contributed abstracts;
 - Poster submissions are strongly encouraged.
4. Presentations should be prepared in a format compatible with PowerPoint or PDF. Oral presentations must be delivered in person, either using a personal laptop or the PC provided in the session room (Windows operating system with PowerPoint and Acrobat Reader available). Speakers are requested to arrive at the session room at least 15 minutes before the start of their session to upload their presentation or set up their laptop connection;

5. For poster presentations, the layout and design of the poster are flexible. A recommended poster size is approximately 120 cm × 80 cm (A0 format). The inclusion of the Workshop logo on the poster is not mandatory;
6. Posters must be prepared in English in order to be eligible for poster awards;
7. The available poster board area is approximately 90 cm (width) × 100 cm (height). Authors must provide their own printed poster, including title and author information. Adhesive materials and session identification labels will be provided by the Workshop staff.
8. Each poster must be accompanied by a self-supporting hanging system (rod and string, or equivalent) to ensure proper mounting during the poster session;
9. Authors are requested to mount their posters on the morning of their assigned poster session and remove them at the end of that day;
10. Certificates of presentation will be issued to presenting authors after the Workshop.
